Acceptable Items for Electronics ("E-Waste") Recycling

Accepted Items:

Computers, Printers, Copiers, Monitors, Keyboards, Speakers, Mice, Cables, Televisions, VCR's, Radios, Stereo Equipment, Tape Records, Record Players, Telephones, PBX Systems, Answering Machines, Networking Equipment, Hubs, Switches, Routers, Cables, Video

Recorders, Video Monitors, Security Systems, CB Radios, Cell Phones, Pagers, PDAs, Cash Registers, Walkmans, Typewriters, Adding Machines, Calculators, Software, CDROM/Floppy Disc, Cables, Cords, UPSs, Surge Strips, Scanners, Digital Cameras, MP3 Players, Electronic Keyboards, Computer parts/components, Rechargeable Batteries, Cables/wire/aluminum, Racks/carts, Non-PCB Ballasts

Free Clean-up also includes:

Broken furniture ie. sofas, chairs, tables, etc.; kids toys, mattresses, pillows, bed frames, grills; microwaves, toaster ovens, coffee makers, dried latex paint cans, lawn furniture, empty buckets, etc...

- * **four car tires and one appliance** per household accepted at no charge.
- * **brush and tree branches.**
- * **one load building materials but no shingles.**

NO household trash accepted!

NO burning barrels accepted!

NO shingles accepted!

Household Hazardous Waste Recycling ALSO

Saturday, September 21, 2019 – 9:00 AM – 12:00 NOON

Items include:

Adhesives/glues, aerosol cans, antifreeze, auto fluids, batteries, cleaning products, drain oil, fertilizers, fluorescent bulbs, mercury thermometer, oil-based paint/thinners, pesticides, pool chemicals, wood stain, weed killers.

Note: Latex paint is not accepted and can be dried and placed in your trash.
